### To Light, to Guard, to Rule and Guide

Throughout Sacred Scripture we find powerful and beautiful examples of God's Holy Angels intervening in human affairs to enlighten, protect and guide His people through the joys and perils of their earthly pilgrimage. The greatest story ever told was to Mary by the Angel Gabriel announcing that she would become the Mother of the Savior, Jesus Christ.

In Our Lord's own life, on the night of His birth, an angel appeared to poor shepherds proclaiming "good news of great joy... and suddenly there was a multitude of heavenly host with the angel, praising God and saying: Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace to those on whom His favor rests." (Lk 2:10,13-14). Before Jesus entered His public life, he went into the desert for forty days to fast and pray. When the devil tempted Him there, the angels came to minister to Him. The night before Jesus died, during His agony in the garden, an angel appeared to Him and strengthened Him in His great distress. And finally, in the Resurrection accounts of Saints Matthew and John, we encounter angels at the tomb of Jesus on that first glorious Easter morning.

In the life of Saint Joseph, an angel appeared to him in a dream and said, "Do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home." (Mt. 1:20) Later, he was instructed by an angel to take Mary and the baby to Egypt to protect them from Herod's plot. When it was safe for them to return home, an angel again advised Saint Joseph to travel by a different route.

The Church's teaching on Guardian Angels emanates from Our Lord's own words of instruction when he says in defense of children, "See that you do not despise one of these little ones, for I say to you that their angels in heaven always look upon the face of my heavenly Father." (Mt 18:10)

Each year on October 2<sup>nd</sup>, the Church celebrates the memorial of the Guardian Angels. Included in the Office of Readings for that day is an excerpt of an uplifting sermon by Saint Bernard, abbott, in which he reflects on Psalm 91:11, "He as given his angels charge over you to guard you in all your ways." He writes:

These words should fill you with respect, inspire devotion and instill confidence; respect for the presence of angels, devotion because of their loving service, and confidence because of their protection. And so the angels are here; they are at your side, they are with you, present on your behalf. They are here to protect you and serve you.<sup>1</sup>

Blessed Carlo Acutis advised his students to treat their Guardian Angel as their best friend.<sup>2</sup> A beautiful way to invoke

and honor our Guardian Angel is with the following traditional Catholic prayer:

Angel of God, my guardian dear,

To whom God's love entrusts me here,

Ever this day be at my side,

To light, to guard, to rule and guide. Amen.
