Saint Wenceslas of Bohemia, martyr (d.935), was known for his generous outreach to his subjects especially on December 26th, the Feast of Saint Stephen. The verses were composed in England in 1853 by John Mason Neale to correspond to the tune of a 13th century Latin spring carol. The Christmas carol as we know it provides a snapshot of the generous spirit of Saint Wenceslas. By extension, as represented by his page, the carol illustrates how our persevering kindness towards those in need not only assists them, but always enriches us as well, helping us to become saints.

Speaking of generosity and kindness, for all the many ways in which you have supported Our Lady of Grace Catholic Spirituality Center during the past year, we are so very grateful. Together in mission with you, we are honored and blessed to joyfully carry out this important work for Our Lord.

Good King Wenceslas Lyrics by John Mason Neale (1853)

1 Good King Wenceslas looked out on the Feast of Stephen, When the snow lay round about, deep and crisp and even. Brightly shone the moon that night, though the frost was cruel, When a poor man came in sight, gath'ring winter fuel.

2 "Hither, page, and stand by me, if you know it, telling, Yonder peasant, who is he? Where and what his dwelling?" "Sire, he lives a good league hence, underneath the mountain, Right against the forest fence, by Saint Agnes' fountain."

3 "Bring me food and bring me wine, bring me pine logs hither, You and I will see him dine, when we bear them thither." Page and monarch, forth they went, forth they went together, Through the cold wind's wild lament and the bitter weather.

4 "Sire, the night is darker now, and the wind blows stronger,Fails my heart, I know not how; I can go no longer.""Mark my footsteps, my good page, tread now in them boldly,You shall find the winter's rage freeze your blood less coldly."

5 In his master's steps he trod, where the snow lay dinted; Heat was in the very sod which the saint had printed. Therefore, Christian men, be sure, while God's gifts possessing, You who now will bless the poor shall yourselves find blessing.

A Spiritual Director for the Ages

Saint John of the Cross is widely regarded as one of the greatest spiritual directors in the history of the Church. He is sometimes referred to as the Mystical Doctor in recognition of the vast scope of his writings on the soul's union with God.

Born in 1542 at Fontiveros, Spain, the experience of great poverty in his childhood left a huge imprint on John. As a Carmelite priest he was known for his tender solicitude toward the poor and sick. "But his deepest concern was for those who in their spiritual life were suffering. The needs of souls undergoing interior trials prompted him to write the books *The Ascent of Mount Carmel* and *The Dark Night.*"¹

Printed below are the last five stanzas from one of his beautiful poems, "Romance 8—The Incarnation" that makes for a wonderful Christmas meditation—so simple and easy to read, and at the same time so profound as to invite rich and deep contemplation on the mysteries of the Christmas Feast.

Romance 8. *The Incarnation* (continued)²

- Then He called The archangel Gabriel And sent him to The virgin Mary,
- At whose consent The mystery was wrought, In whom the Trinity Clothed the Word with flesh.
- And though Three work this, It is wrought in the One: And the Word lived incarnate In the womb of Mary.
- And He who had only a Father Now had a Mother too, But she was not like others Who conceive by man.
- From her own flesh He received His flesh, So He is called Son of God and of man.
