A Saint at the Age of Eleven

On June 24, 1950, Mrs. Assunta Goretti received one of the rarest blessings of any mother in the

history of Catholicism. With hundreds of thousands of people present, she was afforded the great privilege of living to see her daughter, Maria, proclaimed a saint by Pope Pius XII at St. Peter's Basilica. Even more stunning, seated next to Mrs. Goretti was Maria's repentant murderer, Alesandro Serenelli. Following Maria's example who forgave Alesandro while in excruciating pain from his multiple stabbings, Mrs. Goretti likewise forgave him on behalf of the family in the hall of the tribunal where his trial for murder and attempted rape was held. He was sentenced to thirty years in prison.

Born in Italy into extreme poverty, American biographer C.E. Maguire wrote in his book, Saint Maria Goretti, Martyr of Purity, "The child was pious in a mature, balanced, sensible, loving way—not in a sentimental or soft or scrupulous way. From her early childhood, she faced hardship. She had before her the example of affectionate Christian parents, devoted to each other and to their children, and faithful to their religious responsibilities. When her time of temptation came, she resisted it absolutely, and with a superhuman fortitude which only grace could sustain.

Yet she was so human and so aware of others that she could see in the terrible incident more Alessandro's danger than her own. Her cry, 'You'll go to Hell!' was a warning, not a threat, as we must see in her [deathbed] pardon of her assassin, which was free and unforced despite the atrocious suffering she was still enduring because of him. She was, even not yet twelve, a valiant woman." ¹ Alessandro was twenty.

Just before his death in 1970 at the age of 88, Alessandro was asked what his advice to youth would be. He responded, "I sincerely ask pardon of God and of the entire world for the crime which I committed against the martyr, Maria Goretti, and against purity. With all my heart I plead with you to avoid all immoral literature and shows, and whatever else will lead you into sins of impurity." ²

Near the picture of his victim he would often say, "I killed a saint, and now after 69 years of penance and prayer, by God's mercy I am going to join her in heaven." Alessandro attributed his repentance to her heavenly intercession. Following his release from prison, he worked for twenty four years as a gardener in a Capuchin Monastery.

We are honored that, in God's providence, Our Lady of Grace Catholic Spirituality Center was incorporated on July 6, 2010, the Feast of St. Maria Goretti. As our special patroness, we count on her intercession in our work. St. Maria Goretti, pray for us.
